Director of Ballet Co. A native of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Richard began his training at Pittsburgh Ballet Theater School under Artistic Director Patricia Wilde. While there he performed with Pittsburgh Ballet Theater Company in George Balanchine's "The Nutcracker".

Richard later attended and graduated from Canada's National Ballet School. There he was given the immense opportunity to train with world

renowned teachers like NBS' Artistic Director Mavis Staines, the school's founder Betty Oliphant, international modern dancer Peggy Baker, Glenn Gilmore, David Howard, and others. He also performed Alaskan Rag from Kenneth MacMillian's "Elite Syncopations", "Here we come" by Eric Bruhn, "Marimba" by Lar Lubovitch, "Sudden Impulse" by David Nixon, among others. Richard was awarded the Peter Dwyer Award for dance


